# Reverend's Message

Aloha everyone.

I returned to Maui from Japan at the end of August. While I was in Japan, I was shocked to see the news about the wildfires that occurred in many different places on Maui. It was widely reported in Japan too and I received many messages of concern from my friends and family. I also received a message from Rev. Oyama, the former resident minister of Mantokuji. He too was very worried about all of you. This was a tragedy, and I cannot find the words to express my feelings for those who were affected by the devastation. I sincerely hope that everyone will be able to return to a peaceful life as soon as possible. Maui is an important place with many memories for me. I know it will take time, but as a member of the community, I would like to walk with them on the road to recovery.

Everything is changing. Impermanence is the fundamental teaching of Buddhism. Much has no doubt changed in the past month, but there is no sorrow that lasts forever. Let us believe that things will surely move in a better direction. The hearts from around the world are with the community and families of Maui.

On October 1<sup>st</sup>, Daruma-ki Service will be held at Mantokuji. As you know, Bodhidharma was a Zen master who spread Buddhism from India to China. He was a man of perseverance who is known to have sat in zazen facing a wall for nine years. The Daruma doll, which gets up no matter how many times it falls, represents the strong mind of the Zen master. Even when things are difficult or painful, it rises up by itself. I hope that the Drama doll will give you the courage to persevere and rise up when faced with life's challenges.

After the service, we will have a picnic with games and lunch. Because we did not have a picnic last year, I am very much looking forward to it. Please join us for the service and picnic. I look forward to meeting you all on October 1st.
